- **1.Identifying connectors**
- 2. Matching one to one
- 3. Matching one to a group of same interest
- 4. Identifying people to participate in an existing event/activities
- 5. Imagine a new event/activity

This planning process depends on starting with the first question. Starting with the second or third question usually results in residents not being strongly involved.
