Start, Implement and Evaluate

Timeline for your Intergenerational Program

Start with the complete duration of the program and work around that. For example, determine your first visit date and work backwards to determine when to recruit, train, etc.

Sample timeline for a Care Centre/School Program.

1. Collaboration with others and coordination of details: April – June
2. Recruitment of youth: September
3. Collection of application/consent forms from parents of youth: end of September
4. Training of youth (and seniors, if applicable): first two weeks of October
5. Orientation of youth in care centre: last two weeks of October
6. First visit: First week of November
7. Collection of photo consent forms from seniors: end of November
8. Break over Christmas holidays
9. First visit in January: first week back to school
10. Planning and prep for wind-up event: April/May
11. Date of last visit: end of May
