Ine way in Network and Program Background


The Way In Network is a collaboration of 4 agencies (JFSC, Calgary Seniors' Resource Society, carya, and CCECA) with over ten years' experience providing in-home supportive referrals, and case management services for older adults across Calgary.

Building on the strength of network collaboration, this program aims to improve the integration of health and community-based seniors services with a focus is on improving coordination of non-health related services that support healthy aging in community and enhancing the quality of life for seniors.

Successes: Year 1

205 Referrals

since January 2023



- •Strong referral pathways from PCNs and acute care sites in Calgary
- Developed community of practice with front-line staff to support with training
- Diversity worker role established

Chailenges/ Learnings/Gaps: Year 1

- Complexity and high acuity of referrals including mental health and addiction
- Staff turn-over and burnout
- Implementing Linkworker position within outreach approach
- Maintaining referral pathways with health system

- Safety considerations for front-line staff
- Gaps in services for age

- System capacity to accept referrals (e.g. long waittimes)

Excitement for Year 2/3

- Program expansion in Calgary
- Utilizing the Link worker role to help support our outreach teams and the older adults connect to their communities
- Continued expansion and support of current referral pathways
- Connect with other community-based serving agencies in Calgary to help support

our older adult clients

- Participation in the provincial community of practice and see how we can align further to support the development and expansion of social prescribing in Alberta
